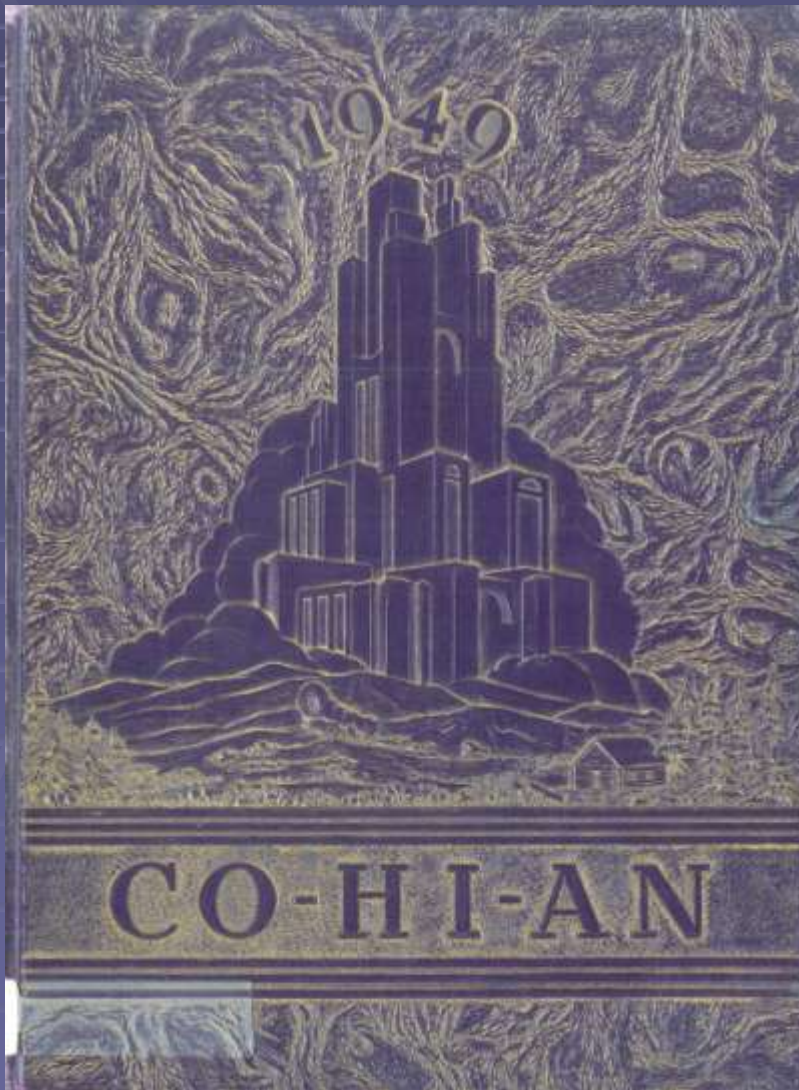


# REMEMBER WHEN - 1949


