Instructional Highlights: Science, English, Physical Education and Music

Science:

In April, the Science Department was able to bring the Physics Bus from Ithaca for two days of hands-on, experience based learning for the 8th grade and Physics students. This summer we are sending 13 students to either the Biological Research Station at Cranberry Lake or the Cornell 4-H camp in Riverhead on Long Island. Students have the opportunity to earn half a science credit. Through daily field excursions, laboratory and field exercises, and presentations, students will develop a better understanding of ecological concepts while working with students from the central NY area. For students who are working towards earning college credit, we are continuing to offer Honors Physics and Chemistry, AP Biology and Physics, and Astronomy. We have several science electives for students with medical or law enforcement interests.

English:

The Common Core English Regents exam takes place on Wednesday, June 14th, at 8:00 am, and there are a number of ways that students can prepare for it. The English Department offers review classes, led by Mr. Bush, who will be conducting review sessions in his classroom on June 5, 6, 7, 8, and 12 from 3:00-4:00. Students who feel they need extra help in English can also attend Academic Tables on Mondays from 3:00 to 4:00. Furthermore, a good on-line resource to help prepare for the Common Core English Regents can be found at Regentsreviewny.net. This website describes each of the sections on the exam and provides sample questions with answers and explanations.

Finally, there will be some new faces in the English department next year. Ms. Balfour, Mrs. Passeri-Densmore and Mr. Marks will be retiring and will be replaced by new teachers. In addition, there will be a new department head next year - best of luck to Mr. Porter as he assumes that position.

Physical Education:

The Physical Education staff are hoping to gain feedback from students with a survey to help improve our instruction starting in the fall of 2017. Student feedback is important too and we want to relate more to our students at Cortland. As a result, our staff came up with a questionnaire to survey the students and gather information to use and improve our physical education curriculum.

Music:

The music department is continuing its spring concerts. Mr. Eleck's final band concert will be on June 1 before he retires after 31 years of service to Cortland Jr/Sr High School. The first Cortland Jamfest will feature 15 student bands from the Modern Band Program at Homer Center for the Arts on June 2 at 7:30. Additionally, come out to the Dairy Parade on June 6 to see the Marching Band!

Other Instructional News and Notes:

- Comic Book Day at the CJSJS Library was a phenomenal success! Students poured in from all over the school to join us for the event, and we were excited to see both regular and new faces! Activities that we had planned for the day included Dungeons and Dragons, a Drawing Group, and a Wii Tournament. We would like to thank Noel Passeri for joining us and adding his expertise to the members of our drawing group. The students enjoyed learning from him. We would also like to give a shout out to Alyssa Harvey from the Cortland Free Library for providing support and the Wii for our tournament. She also shared all of the great things that are available for teens at our local library, including their Teen Advisory Board, and their *Read It, See it* events that are held once a month. A local community member, Michael Delage, served as our Dungeon Master, and the response to the game was overwhelming! There were students from all grade levels engaging with one another positively and working as a team. Finally, we would also like to thank Diamond Publishing and OCM BOCES, who provided all of our tenth graders with a free comic book, and we were able to provide additional copies for many other students as well.

As a result of the enthusiasm over our Dungeons and Dragons activity, we have invited students who wish to do so, to stop in on their lunch or study hall breaks, and begin an impromptu game. We are also hoping to purchase our own Dungeons and Dragons supplies over the summer, and begin a more formal group in the next school year. We are excited to provide students with the opportunity to build their math, teamwork, character building, and leadership skills.

The interest in drawing Manga characters or engaging with others about comic books also drew large crowds of interested students. Our collection of graphic novels continues to grow, as a result of student interest, and we hope in the next

school year to collaborate with the Cortland Free Library to bring a comic book group to our school or start one of our own. Graphic Novels provide students with visual literacy skills, and expose students to unique and varied vocabulary.

- Seventh grade Spanish students began working on their autobiographies as a part of their final exam review. They will be producing a small book, done entirely in Spanish describing themselves, their school, family, house, favorite foods and sports.
- On Monday, May 22nd physics and math students traveled to Darien Lake to see the real-life application of the material they have been learning all year. As a culminating experience, students got to ride roller coasters and then synthesize everything they have learned and apply it to rides such as the ride of steel and mind-eraser. As an extension, students came back to class and built their own roller-coasters.

- Congratulations to Logan Chase for receiving a scholarship from the Breakfast Rotary Club recently.
- Mrs. Passeri-Densmore's Team 3 English students tied for first place in the 8th grade category of the 2017 NASA Space Settlement Contest. There were more than 1,500 submissions from over 6,000 students in the entire 7th - 12th grade contest. In this international competition, students must research the latest space technology and create detailed plans for an orbital space settlement in one or more locations of the solar system. Mrs. Passeri-Densmore's students created QUAD (Quadruple United Allied Destinations), a federation of four sites, one in Near Earth Orbit, another in wide Earth orbit in the LaGrange 4 location between the Earth and moon, one revolving around Mars, and a final one traveling from Mars to the outer planets to mine helium 3, a fuel for nuclear fusion energy. All QUAD locations used only resources found on asteroids, planets, or moons in our solar system. Mrs. Passeri-Densmore will display Team 3 students' entry with related visual materials at the [International Space Development Conference \(ISDC\)](#) in St. Louis, Missouri, on May 25-29, 2017.

Interested in playing a sport? *Some important information you should know:* For any athlete intending to play a sport, it is necessary to complete and have on file in the nurse's office the following: Pre-Participation Evaluation Form, Health History Form and Concussion Management Form. You must also have a current physical (less than one year old) on file in order to obtain a stamped white card (emergency info card) that is required before any athlete plays a sport or participates in cheerleading. See the school nurse for all the necessary paperwork and to schedule a physical.
