Our Technology Planning Committee (TPC) is the advisory group for instructional technology in the district. The Team consists of Asst Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction, Instructional Support Specialist, Director of Technology, Director of Business, representation of both Elementary and Highschool teachers along with the Director of Support Staff for Student Teachers from SUNY Cordand. TPC meets 6 times a year to strategize, discuss and plan for the future needs of the classroom to assist in curriculum to give every student the technology that they need to succeed.

We met as a team in the fall of 2017 to prepare a Survey for Staff and Students that would ask for input on what the classroom and instruction needs were. The survey was sent to all staff and students. The team met again in the winter and spring months of 2018 to discuss the needs from the survey. The team decided that Gsuite for Education would become the standard LMS for the classroom and that we would replace our 1-1 devices with Chromebooks as they were to be replaced with the replacement cycle. 3 different model Chromebooks were purchased for piloting and placed in a core group of staff and students hands for testing. The pilot lasted 3 months and prior to school letting out in June, we decided on one Staff and one Student model to purchase.

The DOT, Asst Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction, the Business Administrator along with the Instructional Support Specialist met during the summer months to review the survey needs and to begin working on our technology plan that would ensure funding sources, training, and replacement plans.

TPC met again in September to review the plan and to approve. The plan was then presented to the Board of Education for review.

For some tools, such as a new student information system, training has been required and is provided on conference days and early-release days. Teachers have been trained to serve as turn-key trainers and resources.

For other things, such as G Suite for Education, digital storytelling, diagnostic and formative assessment tools, media creation, and online study resources, training is invitational. These training opportunities occur after school or asynchronously. Teachers are compensated for their participation.

Survey data are collected from alumni and community businesses. Staff participation in training is logged. We monitor usage of devices in general as well as on specific platforms and programs.
