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Reading and Writing News

We continue to focus on paragraph **writing** and will begin incorporating this into letter writing soon.

This week we will begin our **Reader's Notebooks.** In our notebooks we will keep a log of our reading this year and next week we will begin writing letters about our independent reading books. Each child is responsible for one letter per week which will be graded and responded to. There are suggestions for letter topics and grading rubrics for the letters in the blue section of the Reader's Notebook.

We continue to **read independently.** The AR quarter will end on November 6th, and students should have earned 75%(or more) of their points by Friday October 23rd. Please continue encouraging them to read for at least <u>20 minutes at day at home</u>. We are still **reading** our first class novel, <u>Maniac Magee</u> by Jerry Spinelli. We've been thinking hard about how difficult our lives would be if we were in Maniac's shoes. Maniac is also teaching us new and fun vocabulary words.

In **Reading Workshop**, we continue to use our Reader's Notebooks by keeping a log of our reading throughout the year and writing letters WEEKLY about our independent reading books. Each child is responsible for one letter/week which will be graded and responded to. Feel free to ask to see your child's Reader's Notebook any time.

We are **reading independently** and the AR quarter will end on November 6th. Many children have done a great job getting right into their IR, while others are struggling to find 'just the right books'. Please encourage your child to read daily at home for at least 20 minutes! We continue **reading** a class novel, <u>The Cay</u>, by Theodore Taylor. We are interested to see the main character's feelings towards his 'raft partner'. See what your child thinks...

We are focusing on paragraph **writing** and will continue our whole group minilessons to encourage staying with the topic. Ask to see your child's writer's notebook.

In **Reading Workshop**, students continue to focus on choosing and reading good books and reaching their independent reading goals. The quarter will end on November 6th and students should have read at least 6 books at their level by that time. Please continue to encourage them to read at home.

We have also begun a read-aloud of <u>Baseball in April and Other Stories</u>, by Gary Soto. This is a collection of short stories about growing up. Students have been focused on making connections to their own lives, and using these connections to inspire their own writing.

In **Writing Workshop**, students continue to learn new strategies for using their Writer's Notebook to write about their lives. We recently explored writing about unforgettable stories that move us and things that we wonder about.
