# Reading and Writing News



### Miss Podsiedlik

In **writing** we are focusing on paragraph structure. We have been working hard at writing enticing topic sentences, 5-7 interesting detail sentences, and a conclusion sentence. We enjoyed our first large group mini lesson and are looking forward to our next one this coming week!

Everyone is doing a great job planning ahead and not procrastinating until Thursday night with their **spelling** units. Keep up the hard work!

We are **reading** independently and have set up our first quarter AR goals. The quarter will end on November 6th, and students should have earned 50% (or more) of their points by Friday October 9th. Please continue encouraging them to read for at least 20 minutes at day at home.

We also began **reading** our first class novel, <u>Maniac Magee</u> by Jerry Spinelli. We are reading the book as a whole class and having fun learning about the legends of Jeffrey "Maniac" Magee!

In **Reading Workshop** we continue to learn about book choices, (easy, just right and challenging books) how we can choose the 'just right' books for us, etc. We have begun using our Reader's Notebooks by keeping a log of our reading throughout the year and next week we will begin writing letters about our independent reading books. Each child is responsible for one letter/week which will be graded and responded to. Feel free to ask to see your child's Reader's Notebook any time.

We are **reading independently** and have set up and discussed our AR goals for the first quarter. Please encourage your child to read daily at home! We have just begun **reading** a class novel, <u>The Cay</u>, by Theodore Taylor. It is a great story about survival, tolerance, disability and friendship.
