Our **Reader's Notebooks** are a lot of fun. This past week we focused on writing about the genre of our independent reading book. Next week our letters will focus on whether or not we would recommend the book to another reader and why. The why is the most important part. Our letters should be filled with details from our stories to back up our opinions.

The first **AR** quarter ended on November 6th. The majority of our class was able to meet their goal, bravo! We have established new goals for the next quarter, ask your student to share their goal and progress with you. Please continue encouraging them to read for at least <u>20 minutes at day at home</u>.

We will be finishing our first class novel, <u>Maniac Magee</u> by Jerry Spinelli soon. We are really enjoying the story and have had many great discussions about the characters.

This week we continued practicing our letter **writing**. We wrote letters to our fellow 6th grade team members about how we are doing this year.

In **Reading Workshop**, we continue to write letters WEEKLY about our independent reading books. Your child has an assigned day it is due each week.

Only half of the class reached their AR goal this quarter. Mostly importantly, this means that SOME children are not reading enough independently. Please remind your child to read daily.

We finished our class novel, <u>The Cay</u>, by Theodore Taylor. The children seemed to genuinely enjoy the survival story which focused on friendship and understanding. They were sad to read about Timothy's death and displayed real concern for Phillip's well being. Next week, we will read Time For Kids each day as a class, discussing important current events and then we will begin a new class novel the following week.

We are writing in our writer's notebook, writing letters about 6th grade and completing self-evaluations about our progress so far this year. Look for this at conferences!

In **Reading Workshop**, we continue to focus on identifying the genre of the books we read. We have enjoyed several different stories, across different genres, and have discussed the distinguishing features of each. In addition, we continue to focus on choosing and reading good books independently. This quarter students must read 7 chapter books at their level. Please continue to encourage them to read at home.

In **Writing Workshop**, students continue to use their Writer's Notebook to write about their lives. In addition, students have been working on a persuasive letter to new parents about why they think it is important to read to newborns. Through a project with the Family Reading Partnership and the Books at Birth program, we are hoping that our letters will go home with the new parents of all babies born at Cortland Regional Hospital, along with a special book, <u>The Very</u> <u>Hungry Caterpillar</u>, by Eric Carle.
