In **Reading Workshop**, we focused on identifying character traits demonstrated by characters. Students used their Reader's Notebooks to write letters about a word that described a character in their book and supported their choice with examples and details from the book. In guided reading, some students finished reading <u>The School Story</u>, by Andrew Clements, while others completed <u>Bridge to Terabithia</u>, by Katherine Paterson. Another group of students is writing their own Catwings story after completing several books in the <u>Catwings</u> series by Ursula Le Guin.

In Writing Workshop, students completed a writing assignment similar to they test-type writing they will see on their NYS ELA exams this spring. Students were asked to select a theme that matched a passage from the book <u>When Marian Sang</u>, by Pam Munoz Ryan, and support their choice with details from the passage. Students also continued to use their Writer's Notebook to write about their lives. They will soon be choosing one or two of their "seed" entries to develop into a personal narrative.
